



DISCOVER CATHEDRAL CITY

Incorporated nearly four decades ago (1981) Cathedral City offers residents and visitors alike a sense of community and quality of life unparalleled in the Coachella Valley. Cathedral City retains a strong service orientation with its own police and fire departments, along with public schools ranked among the best in the region. Its neighborhoods, some established long before the City's incorporation, retain a strong sense of character and identity.

Strategically located, with borders on both side of Interstate 10, Cathedral City is a haven for expanding and relocating businesses. Cathedral City ranks in the top three cities in the Coachella Valley in population, retail sales and total taxable sales.

Businesses view the region as a triangle of opportunity between Los Angeles and San Diego with Coachella Valley inland equidistant from each. This triangle of commercial businesses, light industry, and professional services is expanding and becoming one metropolis of continued growth.

Interesting Facts

- The city was named after a canyon that reminded an early explorer of a European cathedral.
- Cathedral City has the second highest full-time population in the Coachella Valley.
- Named one of the "top ten best bargain retirement spots" by US News and World Report.
- Perez Road Design District offers housewares and furniture shops with mid-century modern and vintage merchandise you won't find at big-box stores.
- Cathedral City has an expanding art-in-public-places program, with sculptures adorning a variety of locations.
- Cathedral City named one of the 'most livable' cities by the Conference of Mayors and Waste Management, Inc.
- Rio Vista Elementary was named both a Title I Academic Achievement School and a California "Exemplary" Distinguished School, the bonus "exemplary" being awarded to only 30 schools in the state.
- The city was the teenage home of actress Suzanne Somers, and a winter residence for actors Robert Duvall and Martin Landau in the 1960s, and TV show host Monty Hall in the 1990s.
- Timothy Bradley, the former WBO welterweight champion, and Cub Swanson, current UFC featherweight champion, are from Cathedral City and graduated from Cathedral City High School.
- Frank Sinatra's grave is located in Desert Memorial Park cemetery, as are those of several other prominent figures, including actress Jane Wyman, actor William Powell, and singer-songwriter Sonny Bono, former mayor of Palm Springs.
- Chicano folk musician Lalo Guerrero lived in Cathedral City in his final years.


HOTELS



TRAFFIC COUNTS












FUTURE SEGMENT OF PROPOSED **50-MILE ALTERNATIVE** TRANSPORTATION TRAIL
